## I Wonder Why:

If baptism is by sprinkling or pouring, why Paul said we are "buried with him in baptism," Col. 2:12. And why the eunuch, when being baptized, "went down into the water," and then "came up out of the water," Acts 8:38-39.

If baptism is not necessary to salvation, why Peter told the pricked in the heart Jews on Pentecost to "repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins," Acts 2:38. And why Peter also said "there is also an antitype which now saves us—baptism (not the removal of the filth if the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God), through the resurrection of Jesus Christ," I Peter 3:21.

If sinners are justified by "faith only," why James said "by works a man is justified and not by faith only," and why he also said "faith without works is dead," Jas. 2:24,26.

Why many people profess to love God, but refuse to obey God. Do they not know that Jesus said "<u>If</u> anyone loves Me, he will keep my word," and He also said "He who <u>not love</u> Me does not keep My words," John 15:23,24

**Why** some "Christians" sing "I want to be a worker for the Lord," but can't find the time to regularly assemble with the saints to worship God, and make no attempt to win others to the Lord. Do they not know that Jesus said, "By this My Father is glorified that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples," John 15:8?

Yes, there are many things which cause me to "wonder why," especially when I see the contradictions between the **professions** of many people and their actual <u>practice</u>. But the "bottom line" is this: what we <u>believe</u> must harmonize with what the **Bible says**, and our **works** must harmonize with our <u>words</u>. Remember, the Scribes and Pharisees? Jesus condemned them because, as He said, "they say and <u>do not do</u>," Matt. 23:2.

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
