# PAUL'S CONCERN FOR ALL THE CHURCHES

#### Introduction

- 1) 2 Corinthians 11:22-28 Paul lists the sufferings that he endured as an apostle of Christ
- 2) He ends with a matter that pressed upon him daily: "my deep concern for all the churches"
  - a) "There is that which presseth upon me daily, anxiety for all the churches" (ASV)
  - b) "There is the daily pressure on me of concern for all the churches" (NAS)
  - c) "I face daily the pressure of my concern for all the churches" (NIV)
  - d) "There is the daily pressure on me of my anxiety for all the churches" (ESV)
- 3) This implies that Paul:
  - a) Had knowledge of *local* churches of Christ in various places (no denominations existed)
  - b) Had considerable concern over the physical and spiritual welfare of all these churches
- 4) We need to have concern for the church here, and for faithful churches everywhere

- B) To pray for brethren here and everywhere?
- C) To encourage faithful brethren to stand for the truth and oppose error?

Paul knew that Satan is always busy trying to destroy God's people. Each local church must have members that are **deeply concerned** for that congregation. The non-committed and unconcerned will not encourage growth or be watchmen against error. We must stay concerned about this local church and churches all over the world in these troubling and challenging times. Each one is needed in this lost world. Let us work and pray!
