## "AND THE LORD REMEMBERED NOAH" Marc Gibson

## "And the Lord remembered Noah, and every living thing, and all the animals that were with him in the ark. And God made a wind to pass over the earth, and the waters subsided." (Genesis 8:1)

To say that the "Lord remembered Noah" is an example of describing the actions of an infinite God in a way that we can understand. It is as though He "forgets" them. This is the blessing of forgiveness in Christ! As we all struggle with forgetfulness, I am comforted by the fact that God remembers us. I am confident that He always gives His attention to His people and acts in our best interest. I need to remember God each day of my life, giving full attention to things concerning His kingdom (Eccl. 12:1; Matt. 6:33; Col. 3:1-2).
