## Freedom in Christ – What it is, and What it is Not

#### Introduction:

- 1. "Freedom!" This word is filled with meaning to every true American! For "freedom," many wars have been fought, and countless lives have been sacrificed. "Freedom" is a fundamental, basic, human desire; it is something multitudes consider as being almost sacred.
- 2. With reference to this nation, the Revolutionary War was fought in order to gain freedom from Great Britain.
  - a. Following that war, on July 4, 1776, Congress adopted the Declaration of Independence. Paragraph number two of the "Declaration" states: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, **Liberty** and the pursuit of Happiness."
  - b. With political freedom in mind, the U.S. Constitution was also written in 1787; it was signed on Sept. 17, 1787; it was ratified on June 21, 1788. Today it is the oldest written Constitution in operation in the world. The Preamble to the Constitution says: "We the people of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, establish justice, insure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defense, promote the general welfare, and secure the **blessing of liberty** to ourselves and to our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America."
    - (1) Interestingly, the first amendment to the Constitution has to do with "freedom of speech."
- 3. Yes, our "Founding Fathers" were interested in Freedom!
- 4. But long before anyone ever heard of "our founding fathers," Jesus Christ came to this earth; he came in order to make freedom possible for every human being! John 8:31,32,36; Rom. 7:24-8:2. And Jesus made the Supreme Sacrifice to make this freedom available; He died upon that cruel cross of Calvary! Heb.2:9,14-15.

#### **Discussion:**

### I. What is Freedom?

- A. Freedom, the noun.
  - 1. Translated from *eleutheria*, literally means "manumission from slavery," Vine.
  - 2. As it relates to this lesson, we are referring to the slavery of sin!
    - a. John 8:34; Romans 6:16.
  - 3. Man was created and given dominion over the beasts of the earth, birds of the air, etc, Gen. 1:26, but all too often has allowed sin to have dominion over him! Psalm 119:133; Prov. 5:22.
  - 4. Multitudes are addicted (enslaved by)
    - a. Pornography, thus violating such scriptures as: Matt. 5:8,28; Phil. 4:8.
    - b. Greed and covetousness, Ex. 20:17; Col. 3:5.
    - c. Drugs, both legal and illegal. I Cor. 9:25; Prov. 23:29-35.
    - d. Other addictions, such as gambling, behavioral, etc.
- B. Free, the verb.
  - 1. Translated from eleutheroo, and means "to make free," is used of deliverance from:
    - a. Sin, John 8:32,36; Rom. 6:18,22.
    - b. The Law, Gal. 5:1.
    - c. The bondage of corruption, Rom. 8:21.
- C. Freely, the adverb.
  - 1. Translated from *eleutheroos*, and means:
    - a. Freedom from obligations in general, Rom. 7:3: I Cor. 7:39.
    - b. From bondage or slavery, John 8:33, Gal. 3:28; Eph. 6:8.

#### II. Freedom in Christ is:

- A. Freedom from Sin!
  - 1. John 8:31-32; Rom. 6:16.
- B. Freedom from the Law of Moses.
  - 1. First century judaizing teachers tried to influence Christians to subject themselves to the rituals of the law, Acts 15:1-2,6.
    - a. Note Peter's remarks in Acts 15:7-9.
    - b. Peter's question in Acts 15:10.
  - 2. Note the allegory of Hagar and Sarah in Gal. 4:21-31.

- a. **Note** the conclusion in Gal. 5:1. They had been set "free" from the law, and were forbidden to seek justification by that law, Gal. 5:4. Ironically, millions today try to by-pass Jesus Christ saving Gospel and seek justification for their actions by going back to the law "which genders to bondage!"
- C. Freedom from the Law of Sin and Death.
  - 1. The theme of the first eight chapters of Romans is set forth in Rom. 1:16-17.
  - 2. The need for the gospel is set forth in Rom. 3:23.
  - 3. Yet no one could be saved by the works of the law, Rom. 3:20.
  - 4. Now note Rom. 8:1-3,.

#### III. Freedom in Christ is Not:

- A. Freedom From Christ!
  - 1. Freedom of religion must not be misconstrued to mean freedom from religion.
  - 2. Freedom in Christ is not freedom from Christ. Col. 3:16-17; Col. 2:6; Col. 3:1-2.
  - 3. Those who are freed from sin become the servants of righteousness! Rom. 6:17-18.
- B. Freedom From Responsibility!
  - 1. I Peter 2:21; 5:5,6.
  - 2. There are Scriptures which govern the Christian's obligation in every realm of activity.
    - a. To the civil authorities, Rom. 13:1.
    - b. Husbands, Eph. 5:25.
    - c. Wives, Eph. 5:22.
    - d. Children, Eph. 6:1.
    - e. Servants/employees, Eph 6:5.
    - f. Masters/employers, Eph. 6:9.
    - g. All Christians in general, I Peter 2:21.
- C. License to Sin!
  - 1. Romans 5:20-6:4,11-13; 2 Peter 2:19.
- D. Freedom from Restraint, and Accountability!
  - 1. Freedom from restraint leads to anarchy.
  - 2. Note Gal. 5:13,19-21.
  - 3. With freedom comes responsibility and accountability.
    - a. The first amendment to the Constitution grants us freedom of speech. Yet we should not yell "fire" in a crowded building! Nor does it give us the right to use other peoples' ears as garbage dump for our own verbal filth! Eph. 4:29.
    - b. The second amendment gives us the right to bear arms, but that does not give us the right to enter a public place and start shooting at whoever is in sight! Matt. 22:39-40.
- E. Freedom from Servitude!
  - 1. Note Rom. 6:16-19.
- F. Freedom from Law itself!
  - 1. Without law, there could be no real freedom! Cf. James 1:25; James 2:12
    - a. How would we fare in the social realm if there were no government, no laws, no rules, no regulations? It would be complete anarchy! Judges 17:6; 21:25; Jer. 10:23.
  - 2. Freed from the law of Moses, but not from the law of Christ!
  - 3. Rom. 4:15; I John 3:4; Gal. 6:1-2.
  - 4. Col. 3:17.

# IV. More Thoughts about Freedom in Christ.

- A. It is freedom from the agonizing burden of sin, Acts 2:38.
- B. Freedom from the fear of death, Heb. 2:14-15; 2 Tim. 4:L6-8.
- C. Freedom to enjoy "all spiritual blessings," Eph. 1:3.
- D. Freedom to enjoy the hope of eternal life, Titus 1:2.

## **Conclusion:**

- 1. Freedom is not free! John 3:16; Matt. 26:28.
- 2. It comes at a price to the person who wants to be free from sin! Matt. 16:24; Heb. 5:8.
- 3. Jesus can make you "free indeed!" John 8:36.
