Worship is to be done in **spirit and truth.** Two essential elements for acceptable worship given by Jesus.

Worship involves: True worship, not false; God, soul and external acts of worship; and God's will, not man's devices. Jer. 10:23.

 - 2. Attitude shows up in attendance—Heb. 10:25.
- III. Worship must be done in an orderly manner. 1 Cor. 14:40.
 - A. Worship services should be done in a systematic manner to prevent confusion.1 Cor. 14:33; 14:23.
- IV. Worship must be done in reverence. Heb. 12:28.
 - A. To have a profound regard for God.
 - B. Psa. 89:7; Psa. 29:2; Psa. 107.32.
 - C. The name of the lord is to be revered. Matt. 6:9.
- V. Worship must be sincere. Philippians 1:10.
 - A. Must have agreement of heart and tongue.
 - B. Christ denounced insincerity.
 - C. Life will reflect sincerity or lack of it. 1 John 3:18.
- VI. We must be humble.
 - A. To be a part of the Christian's life.

Humility taught by Christ. Matt. 23:12; Matt. 18:4.

- VII. Our worship will be based on individual not group conduct.
