Man's Duality

Definition: duality is a dual condition or quality. It is the state of being two or in two parts.

- I. Man is a duel being—flesh and spirit
 - A. Solomon believed there are two parts to man. Eccl. 12:7.
 - 1. Dust. Gen. 2:7; Gen. 3:19.
 - 2. Spirit. Gen. 1:26-27. "Likeness" denotes a spiritual conformity to God.
 - B. Paul describes man as having two parts. 2 Cor. 4:16.
 - 1. Outward man—flesh.
 - 2. Inward man—spirit.
 - C. James recognized the duality of man. James 2:26.
 - 1. Body.
 - 2. Spirit.
- II. Man is a dual unit.
 - A. Woman is a helper or help meet to man.
 - 1. Gen 2:18—not good for man to be alone.
 - B. Man was the only creature God created alone.
 - C. Longfellow expressed the mutuality in his Hiawatha.
- III. Man's salvation is dual—the divine and he human.
 - A. What God has done to save man. John 3:16.
 - 1. God showed his love for the world by the sacrifice He made for the world.
 - 2. Only one being qualified to be the only Son of God.
 - 3. God showed his hatred for sin by sacrificing His son for the sins of the world.
 - 4. This verse declares God is love, that He loved the world, He gave his Son to save men and that those who believe will have everlasting life.
 - B. What man must do to have salvation.
 - 1. Belief that Jesus is the Son of God along with obedience. 2 Thess. 1:7-9.
 - 2. Obedience begins with faith.
 - a. In God. Heb. 11:6.
 - b. In Christ. Stated in Acts 16:30-31.
 - 3. Repentance is required. Luke 13:3, 5; Acts 2:38.
 - 4. Confession of Christ. Matt. 10:32.
 - 5. Being baptized. Mark 16:16.
 - 6. This process is seen in Acts 2:37-40.
 - C. Man must continue to add to his faith. 2 Peter 1:5-10.
- IV. Man's Christian life is dual—doctrine and practice. Both are important.
 - A. "Practice what you preach." 1 Tim. 4:16.
 - B. No man or angel can make changes to the gospel. Gal. 1:8-9
 - C. A man's faith is proven by his actions. James 2:18.
 - D. A Christian is to be honest in his work and deeds. Titus 2:9-10.
